Five Years after Katrina From the International Habitat website

Habitat's Operation Home Delivery began six weeks after Hurricane Katrina devastated the Gulf coast. Prior to Katrina an average of only 57 homes were built by the Gulf Habitat affiliates. Since then an average of 400 are built or rehabbed per year resulting in a total of over 2200 since the 2005 disaster. An estimated 150,000 volunteers have been involved in the cleanup and rebuilding efforts in the New Orleans area alone through Habitat. This is the essence of the Habitat mission.

HABITAT RESTORE NEEDS YOUR HELP

The affiliate has a ReStore located in the Keystone Business Park on Highway 5 (three miles south of the square on the left), where we sell donated items generating revenue to purchase the materials to construct more homes.

Donations are needed for our resale store. We accept saleable items in good working condition such as furniture, appliances, lighting fixtures, building supplies, useable paint, TV's, household goods such as dishes and utensils and decorative items, sporting goods, boats and trailers, cars, etc. We do not accept clothing.

Store hours are Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm. Items may be dropped off during those hours or, for larger items, you may call (573) 317-3962 to schedule a pick up. VOLUNTEERS ARE <u>ALWAYS</u> NEEDED

If you love prowling the aisles at local hardware stores and lumber yards - enjoy fixing and organizing things or just want to help recycle building materials while supporting adequate housing - the ReStore needs your help!

- Cashiers Assist customers with sale of merchandise, operate cash register and make change with accuracy. Do some minor cleaning and merchandising when you are not busy at register.
- Stockers Assist with ReStore duties and stock shelves; also ensure the operational quality and safe use of donated electrical items. Accept and ensure the quality of donations and assist customers with loading and unloading.
- Truck Driver Drive our 20-foot box truck to pick up large donations. Drivers must have good driving records.

YARD OF THE MONTH PROGRAM

Yard of the Month program has been in place for a year now and has seen great results from our partner families. Each month the families' yards are reviewed to see that they keep up general yard maintenance and perhaps make some small improvements or plantings to improve curb appeal. A winner is picked for the month and they get a Yard of the Month sign placed in their yard and receive a \$25.00 gift card from Home Depot. A monthly newsletter is mailed to the participating families announcing the winner along with handy yard tips. All of the participating families initially received a basket of garden goodies that contained a Home Depot 1-2-3 Gardening book, garden hand tools, gloves, Miracle Grow, daffodil bulbs, a garden mum, and potting soil.

HOME DEDICATION

Dedication for house number 11 was held Saturday, October 9, at 2:00 pm. The new owners are Tara Dishman and her son Christopher. Tara has been a Camdenton resident for 13 years and is a Camdenton alumnus. Her son Christopher is a 3rd grader at Camdenton. Tara works at the Lake of the Ozarks Development Center and enjoys working with people with special needs where they teach them social and academic skills. She takes them out into the community to help them develop their social skills. Academically she helps them by working with their reading and writing skills.

Due to her economic situation Tara thought home ownership was out of her reach until she heard about Habitat from a coworker. Tara applied and was selected as a home recipient. Tara was able to get her "sweat equity" hours in by doing tile work, working at the ReStore, and working at the Homeless Shelter. She indicated that it was hard getting her hours in due to her work schedule.

Tara said that she really loves having a clean house and wants to keep her home nice and clean. She said that the best thing about the house is the washer and dryer and not having a pile of dirty clothes. Best of all, she now has a place to call home. She feels that she can call it "our home" and is able to use it as a savings for the future.

- Applicant's income should not exceed 50% of Camden County Median Income.
- Applicant should have satisfactory credit. Negative factors should be able to be explained and/or corrected.
- Applicant must show the ability to make house payment.
- Applicant must be able to make a down payment of approximately \$750. (They are given a year to save for this and the money is then applied towards their first year of home owners insurance.)
- Applicant's current housing situation is unsatisfactory.
- Applicant is willing to partner with Habitat by providing "sweat equity." If you know of a family who might qualify, please contact Habitat Family

HABITAT - A HAND-UP NOT A HANDOUT

Habitat for Humanity is not a give-away program. Selected families agree to provide "sweat equity" helping in the construction of their home. Upon completion of the home and their "sweat equity" hours, the family enters into a non-interest mortgage with us for a specified number of years.
